

Request for Proposals Domestic Violence Bonus Projects administered by Louisiana Coalition Against Domestic Violence

in the Louisiana Balance of State Continuum of Care

Background

The Louisiana Coalition Against Domestic Violence (LCADV, the Coalition) is accepting proposals to create new Rapid Re-housing (RRH) activities to serve eligible survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, or dating violence (DV) in communities served by the Louisiana Balance of State Continuum of Care (LA BOSCOC). All interested eligible applicants, including all Coalition member organizations, are encouraged to apply.

DV Bonus Projects Information

Through the Funding Year (FY) 2023 Continuum of Care (CoC) Program Competition, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) will competitively fund projects providing housing and services to survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking. The LA BOSCOC will apply for DV Bonus funding to expand the RRH project managed by LCADV, with one or more subrecipients to provide rental assistance and supportive services to survivors of domestic violence. The following sections outline the timeline and process for DV Bonus proposal submission to LCADV, the minimum requirements for eligible applicants, and the required contents of proposals. The application will be reviewed and scored by LCADV. Responses should be specific, succinct, and adhere to the character count limits for each question. Eligible Applicants

Applicants eligible to respond to this RFP must demonstrate experience with or the capacity to employ trauma-informed, victim-centered approaches to service provision. Service providers who are LCADV members in good standing will be given priority for funding under this solicitation, but all entities who can meet the requirements herein are encouraged to apply.

Eligible Activities & Costs

Applicants may submit proposals that serve households with children, without children, or both, and may propose to use the funding for the following eligible RRH activities:

- Rental Assistance, which provides short- to medium-term (3-24 months) of tenant-based rental assistance
- <u>Supportive Services</u>, which provides a range of case management and wraparound services necessary to help participants achieve and maintain permanent housing and self-sufficiency
- <u>HMIS</u>, which funds the costs, including software, equipment, and staffing, of maintaining participant information in a Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) comparable database
- <u>VAWA</u>, which funds the costs of facilitating and coordinating activities to
 ensure compliance with the emergency transfer plan requirement for
 survivors of domestic violence who are in danger and the monitoring of
 compliance with the confidentiality protections.
- <u>Administrative Costs</u>, which funds the administrative activities necessary to support the project; no more than 5% of the project's total funding request can be used for administrative costs (admin)

Applicants selected to receive DV Bonus funds will be required to enter all client-level data into an HMIS comparable database and provide regular reports on project performance to LCADV and the LA BOSCOC.

Applicant Selection Process & Priorities

When selecting applicants to carry out the DV Bonus project, LCADV will give first priority to current LCADV Tier 1 and 2 program members. Further, LCADV will prioritize the following:

- Applicants who meet the eligibility criteria outlined above
- Applicants with demonstrated experience employing best practices to serve survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking, and/or the capacity to provide trauma-informed, client-centered services for survivors in a new project

Applicants selected as DV Bonus RRH project subrecipients will be required to work with LCADV and the LA BOSCOC to finalize projects and applications. LCADV and the LA BOSCOC reserve the right to adjust subrecipient activities as

needed. Applicants may be required to modify proposed services and/or budget targets to maximize funding opportunities and utility.

Prior to submitting their proposal, applicants working with partner agencies are strongly encouraged to develop and sign written agreements that demonstrate and secure the details of each commitment. Written agreements will be required prior to project launch.

Process and Timeline for Submission of Project Proposals

Interested applicants must adhere to the following process and timeline when submitting project proposals:
